REASONS TO BE GLAD FOR THE THESSALONIANS (1 Thessalonians 2:13-14)

- I. The way they received the word of God.
 - A. Paul tells these brethren that he thanked God for them without ceasing.
 - 1. Think of how encouraging this must have been to these brethren that an apostle was continually praying for them.
 - 2. People to whom I speak when sick often comment on their gratitude for the brethren praying for them.
 - 3. It is one of the simplest yet most powerful things we can do to encourage others.
 - B. He was thankful for the way they received the word he preached.
 - 1. Received literally means to associate oneself or to call to one's side.
 - 2. They heard the gospel and associated themselves with it by their obedience to it.
 - C. They associated themselves with it in a way that showed they believed it was from God and not from man.
 - 1. Their view of God's word was one we should emulate.
 - 2. They did not accept it just as the word of some mere man.
 - 3. They realized that what they were hearing was not of human origin.
 - a. If the Bible is objectively studied, it does not take long to see that it is from a greater Being than man.
 - b. Its continuity of thought, preservation, lack of contradiction and authority all show its being from God.
 - 4. These brethren received it as it really is from God.
 - a. There was no doubt on their behalf about from where it came.
 - b. It must be received this way or our faith in it can be shaken.
 - c. If someone presented a good argument for its being from God, and you were convinced by the argument and not material, when someone else gave a convincing argument that it was not from God it would be tempting to follow their ideas.
 - D. This word was believed to be from God because of the work it did in changing their lives.
 - 1. The words "effectually worketh" are from one Greek word from which we get our word energy.
 - 2. It worked in them in way that they felt and knew there was a change based on their belief in and obedience to it.
 - 3. When one believes it, it will change his life.
 - E. Paul rejoiced because of the way they received God's word.

II. Their walk in Christ.

- A. Paul next rejoiced because the way they lived in Christ Jesus.
- B. The way the Thessalonians worshiped and lived was after the model of the original congregations of the Lord's people in Judea.

- C. These brethren served as a model for all Christians, including us.
 - 1. They were the first established because of the Lord's command to first preach in and around Jerusalem and then spread.
 - 2. These congregations worshiped correctly and lived lives worthy of imitation, which is the meaning of the word followers.
- D. By doing this, the Thessalonians could know they were in Christ.
- E. One of the best things we will ever do as Christians is to find someone who is truly Christ like and learn from them.
 - 1. Paul told Titus to have the older teach the younger.
 - 2. The reason for this is experience in the trials of life should give the older brethren a wealth of knowledge.
 - 3. We need our older Christians to pass on what they know to younger Christians.
- F. There never needs to be a disconnect between the older and younger generations.
- G. We need to make sure that both of these groups are connected and maintaining a good relationship for the betterment of each group.
 - 1. The younger can learn from the older.
 - 2. The older can be encouraged and comforted by the younger.
- H. May we ever strive to have a walk that is in Christ that others can emulate.

III. Their willingness to suffer.

- A. One of the ways they emulated the Judean Christians was in their dealing with suffering.
- B. The Jews persecuted God's true Israel unmercifully.
 - 1. We know what Paul did.
 - 2. He was not the only one that treated God's people in that manner.
 - 3. The Jews as a whole were extremely enraged against Christians.
 - 4. Tradition holds that during of the many Roman persecutions of the church, the Jews ran to collect fire wood in order to burn Christians at the stake in Smyrna.
- C. The Thessalonians likewise were persecuted for becoming Christians by people in their own city.
 - 1. They were drug before the city council.
 - 2. They were treated harshly and abused for their belief.
 - 3. A lot of this was caused by the Jews in that city.
 - 4. The Jews would be the ones in the background agitating things in order to get the Gentiles to act against the Christians.
- D. The Jews were not looked upon with great regard by Gentiles because of their attitudes and actions.
 - 1. In Corinth, recorded in Acts 18, the Jews themselves brought Paul before the judge of the city.
 - 2. He told the Jews that he had nothing to do with their law and then the Gentiles took the ruler of the synagogue and beat him.
 - 3. There was no love lost on the Jews so they had to do things in an underhanded manner.
 - 4. They used others to get Christians persecuted.

- E. What was wonderful is that the Thessalonians were remaining faithful in spite of the persecution they were suffering.
- F. Though they were young in the faith, they remained steadfast to Christ and refused to turn from Him during persecution.
- G. As suffering comes our way, we need to be steadfast and resolute in staying with Jesus and not turn away from Him.
- H. These brethren refused to do that and Paul was glad because of their stand with Jesus.
